It was established in 1635, only fifteen short years after the landing of the Pilgrims. These schools are developing the most precious resource of our nation, the latent intelligence of our young people. It is worth noting that social progress in the United States is following swiftly on the heels of the remarkable expansion of educational opportunity at the high school level.

I hope that the young people of every high school in the United States will celebrate this three hundredth anniversary. I hope they will celebrate it in a manner which will bring vividly before the parents and fellow townsmen the significance, the contribution and the goals of their schools.
