PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

I was born in Carmel, as were many of us baby boomers—at the old Community Hospital on Highway 1. But I went to Carmel

schools until the fourth grade. We lived behind Carmel High School, and we would walk up a steep path behind the school to catch the bus to River School.

My mother Raylyn (most of my high school friends will remember, rather, my stepmother Jan) had many friends in Pacific Grove, and I remember driving over what we then called just "the cut-off" rather than "Holman Highway." We took our cats to Dr. Hollister's animal hospital (still do, in fact), and shopped at the Safeway on Forest Hill. (This was before there was any construction

at all at the mouth of Carmel Valley).

My mother's friends lived in the area up the hill from the post office. We also drove to services at the Unitarian Church, which met then in the Masonic Temple. Thus, my mother would invariably turn off of Forest onto Sunset and go past Pacific Grove High School, and then turn right on Congress. As we passed Pacific Grove High School, I would say to my mother, "That's where I'm going to go to high school." My mother would say, "No, you're not. You live in Carmel. You'll go to Carmel High School."

I don't know what bothered me about Carmel High School, but it seemed large and forbidding. Maybe it was the fact that my sister and I had to climb that steep hill behind the campus to reach the high school bus stop. Pacific Grove High School, with its downhill rather than uphill emphasis and its approachable flat buildings, looked much more appealing—and safe—to me.

When I was 10, my parents divorced, and my father moved us to Del Monte Park and David Avenue School. I don't remember being particularly surprised, or even happy, about this. I just knew Pacific Grove, albeit a corner of it far from town, was where I was supposed to be. My mother and her new husband bought a Victorian on the corner of Park and Laurel, within walking distance of the friends she used to drive from Carmel to see. She lived there for 40 years, until her death in 2001, and my half-sister now owns that house and the house next door to it. My stepmother still owns

the house in Del Monte Park—ah, the foresight of those who bought property back then and held onto it!

At the end of my sophomore year, my father and stepmother announced that they had bought a house in—guess where? Carmel Valley. My younger brother and sister acted as if they were going home—back to Carmel schools. I was disgusted. Here I was, safe at Pacific Grove High School, and my parents were trying to put me back into Carmel! I pleaded with them and won. They applied for an inter-district transfer, and for the next two years my father, who worked at the *Monterey Peninsula Herald* as an editor, drove me from Carmel Valley to Pacific Grove each morning. I walked downtown after school to work at the Pacific Grove Public Library as a shelver, sometimes visiting my mother and sometimes my step-grandmother, who lived on Fountain next door to what is now the Seven Gables Inn (another house the family still owns). My father would pick me up at the end of his workday, and we would drive home to Carmel Valley.

The summer between my junior and senior year I attended summer school. Carmel High didn't offer summer school, so there was school-bus service from Carmel Valley to Pacific Grove High School. I felt a little guilty riding a bus meant for Carmel students, but I kept my mouth shut. Summer school was only four hours a day, and it saved me from having to wait until the end of the day for a ride from my father.

I don't know what drew me to Pacific Grove High School so surely, or why I refused to leave it. I don't remember ever thinking, "One day I am going to be in charge of my high school reunions, and I will be president of the PGHS Alumni Association, so I have to go to this school." I believe we all eventually land in the place that's meant for us. There was a reason I attended Pacific Grove schools from fifth grade on, and there's a reason I'm still here, just two blocks from my mother's house on Park Street.

I also believe that service is best performed when we are content with and proud of whom and what we are serving, This month, I'm proud to announce that the Alumni Association awarded 14 scholarships totaling \$12,300 to deserving seniors at Pacific Grove High School. Your donations to the Alumni Association are what make these scholarships possible, and these scholarships in turn are what make it possible for these students to land in their own "places" in life. Thank you all for your continued support of this organization.

Forty years ago in the fall of 1920, the first Girl Scout troop on the Monterey Peninsula was formed in Pacific Grove.

At that time eight Pacific Grove high school freshmen met with their leader (then Miss Esther Pesante) at El Carmelo Inn, Pacific Grove. The troop was called the "Pine Cone Group," and according to council records, some of the members of that troop still reside on the Monterey Peninsula. These include Mrs Robert M. Getz, troop leader (then Miss Esther Cummings), who not only was a girl in Scouting, but who participated actively in the council's growth.

Monterey and built several buildings still standing in PG. Born in Santa Clara County on April 1, 1924, Tom III grew up in PG and graduated from PGHS in 1943. After serving in the Navy during and after World War II. Tom married his wife Virginia, and they relocated to San Diego, where he owned and operated Kensington Hardware Store, a community landmark for 30 years. His good-natured humor and genial personality were an asset to the men's prayer group which he started at the First United Methodist Church, Though Tom loved San Diego, his life and work here, he retained his fondness and appreciation for the beauty and history of the Monterey Peninsula, particularly the Pacific Grove area. He was a 20-year member of PGHS Alumni Association. He was preceded in death by his parents Tom Work Jr. '23 and Violet Curry Work Whittemore '23, and brother Robert Work '43. Survivors include wife of sixty years, Virginia Work; and sisters, Jacqueline Work Bray of Pebble Beach, and Donna Work Silverbert of Palo Alto.

Carl earned his credential at UC Riverside in 1963, and taught social studies at PGHS for 20 years, retiring in 1984. Other former members of this first troop who live on the Monterey Peninsula are Miss Irene Young '24 of Pacific Grove, and Mrs. Vincent J. Garland (the former Emma *Francis* '24) who lived in San Francisco many years but now resides in Pacific Grove. All efforts by the council to locate Miss Pesante have been fruitless.

The next Girl Scout troop on the Peninsula was formed in Carmel in 1924 and met in "Eighty Acres" with Mrs. William Newton as leader.

In 1932 the first Monterey troop was started. The girls in this troop traveled over the hill to Carmel to meet with the Carmel Girl Scouts occasionally. The first French Consulate building, now the Girl Scout headquarters building, was first used for troop meetings in 1935.

(Since the historic Scout headquarters was damaged by fire, the Girl Scout office is temporarily located in the Monterey USO. The Scout phone number there is FR 5-4482.)

At the January 28 Girl Scout Council meeting these former Girl Scouts will be honored, as will former council presidents. At the meeting, a 7 p.m. dinner at the Mark Thomas Inn, Ned L. Klump, Public relations and communications authority, will be the speaker. Presentation of the slate of board of trustees is also scheduled that evening. Reservations for the dinner are being received by Mrs. Robert E. Newton, MA 4-4669.

The deLorimier Family

The Inn at 17 Mile Drive has hosted many gatherings, but none quite so special as on Jan. 15. That day, descendants of the house's original family came home.

The 1920's Craftsman-style house at the corner of Lighthouse and 17 Mile Drive first served as the home of George deLorimier Sr., founder of the Monterey Bay Packing Company, who raised a large family with his wife Virginia. George was a shrewd businessman who built an organization to meet the needs of a burgeoning agricultural industry. Virginia, a powerful swimmer with a tremendous capacity for learning, became a master bridge player who frequently competed at tournaments in San Francisco. One family member said: "As soon as two hands had been played, she could tell you what cards you were holding."

Louise deLorimier Bannon, daughter of George Jr., organized the event. Her original purpose was to pay tribute to Tom de Lorimier, Louise's uncle and the last surviving member of the original family that lived in the house. As relatives learned of the event, it grew into a gathering that filled the Inn and occupied many rooms in nearby lodging establishments.

In a day filled with poignant moments, 103 members of the family deLorimier gathered at the Inn. Innkeepers Jas Barbe and Sally Pauling, along with their staff, accommodated everyone with unflappable ease. The entire group came together for a portrait in the back yard, where many family elders had played as children.

Following a special mass at Santa Catalina Church, everyone went to the clubhouse at Bayonet & Black Horse Golf Course for dinner. There, brothers Jim and Dick deLorimier told stories of pony rides, sailor suits and mutual admiration. "I wanted to be like him," said Dick, pointing to his older brother. "So I became the starting forward on a championship basketball team." He recalled a practical joke involving a can of sardines placed on the radiator of a new Buick convertible. Of the late Tom deLorimier, Dick said, "There was one good-looking guy in the family, and that was Tom."





Out with the old and in with the new.

It took only a few hours for the enormous backhoe to level a building where people had spent years of their lives. Last week, as part of Measure D improvements to the Pacific Grove Unified School District, a building that had served as the District Office and 3 Middle School classrooms went "under the wrecking ball."

The District offices have already moved to a new facility on Hillcrest, also funded by Measure D.

The old District Office was actually an Army housing unit that had been rushed up from Fort Hunter-Liggett in 1948, after a major fire gutted much of Pacific Grove's original high school, said Assistant Superintendent Robin Blakley. "You can imagine the urgency of the situation," Blakley said. "There was a need to get students into rooms as quickly as possible." Later, a new high school was built on Sunset, and the old location became the Middle School.

Attached to the old office was Room 37, where Moira Mahr taught 6th grade English and History, as well as AVID (Advanced Via Individual Determination) classes for 13 years. She and her students have temporarily relocated to a small room downstairs from the Middle School office, awaiting a more permanent placement.

As the machine did its work, students stood by quietly; punctuating the demolition with their occasional exclamations as the bucket bit down on the old roof and knocked a metal railing aside like so many Tinkertoys. Mahr felt that watching the process would help her students say goodbye to their old room. "They were a little sad," said Mahr. "There were a lot of memories." Students also wrote essays about "The Mystery of Room 37."

Former Middle School students stopped by to watch the building go down, many of them now grown and with families of their own. Some remembered it from decades ago. Where they once studied, a parking lot will be added along with 3 modular classrooms to replace the old rooms. The project is scheduled for completion in April.




