President's Message

It's June again, and that means graduations, scholarships, and for the Alumni Association, reunion plans and an update of our Roster.

I attended the Pacific Grove High School Senior Awards Night on a very warm May 14 to present \$16,000 in PGHSAA scholarships to 15 high school seniors. Above, I am presenting an award to Liam Posson. Liam plans to attend Monterey Peninsula College (he already appears on one of my rosters for a summer English class!) and complete its Hospitality Program. Stories about all fifteen of our scholarship award winners appear on P. 10.

Three other notable awards, although not given by the PGHSAA, were the U.S. Naval Academy scholarships given to Michelle Katz and Brian Long, and the \$180,000 U.S. Naval Academy, Marine Division, scholarship given to Caitlin Alt. According to Commander John Pfeiffer, 18,000 students apply each year for the two scholarships won by Michelle and Brian, and only about 1,000 are selected. Michelle and Brian will

join Dean Randall, who graduated from PGHS last year, in the Annapolis class of 2018.

Fewer than 1% of high school graduates across the country receive the Marine Division award, presented to Caitlin at the Senior Awards Night by Captain Melanie Clifton and Sergeant Chad Winchell (below). This, the presenters said, is prestigious for the school as well as for the student. Congratulations to Michelle, Brian, and Caitlin on their decision to serve our country and bring distinction to PG High, to our own award winners, and to the entire Class of 2014.




